# Associate in Arts to Bachelor of Science in Education: Elementary Education with option in <u>Early Childhood Education</u>

This guide is intended to create a smooth and seamless curriculum transition for students who earn the Associate in Arts (AA) at Black Hawk College (BHC) to transfer and complete the Bachelor of Science in Education (B.S.Ed.) with a major in Elementary Education / **option in Early Childhood Education** at Western Illinois University (WIU). This guide incorporates the 2023-2024 BHC and WIU catalogs.

Program and licensure requirements for this major are subject to change without notice. Any new State of Illinois mandated obligations will supersede program requirements identified in this guide.

Degree Availability AA offered on the Quad Cities and East Campuses and online. Science labs are

on-campus only.

B.S.Ed. in Elementary Education/Early Childhood Education option offered in the

GPA Requirements Graduation from BHC 2.00 Admission to WIU 2.00

As part of the entrance requirements to the Teacher Education Program (TEP)

a minimum GPA of 2.00 is required with at least 45 semester hours completed. All grades on the transfer transcript will count in the calculation of the 2.00 GPA to determine eligibility into the major and to enroll in upper-division courses and field experiences. Admission to WIU does not automatically constitute acceptance to the TEP. Students who plan to complete teaching licensure requirements must also apply for admission to the TEP (see the Teacher

Education Program Handbook at wiu.edu/teacher.)

Grade Requirements In accordance with the Illinois State Board of Education licensure rules, all

candidates seeking a Professional Education License or endorsement are required by WIU to obtain a grade of "C" or better in all directed general education courses, all core courses, and all courses in the Early Childhood Education option. This rule does not supersede course prerequisite

requirements in the catalog that specify a letter grade.

General Education Refer to the BHC AA degree requirements for course options as needed.

- ✓ The AA degree includes the IAI General Education Core Curriculum. Completing the AA satisfies WIU University General Education Curriculum.
- ✓ BHC requires **one non-western studies designated course** to complete the AA and it may simultaneously fulfill an IAI GECC category in Humanities, Fine Arts, or Social and Behavioral Sciences, or be taken as an elective.

### **Credit Hours**

✓ A minimum of 60 credits is required to complete the AA degree and a minimum of 24 credits must be earned at BHC.

✓ A minimum of 120 total credits is required to complete the B.S.Ed. in Elementary Education/Early Childhood Education option and a minimum of 60 credits must be earned at WIU.

Other

Students following this guide for an AA degree may also transfer into a <u>non-licensure track</u> leading to the completion of Gateway credentials. Internships are completed instead of student teaching.

The following course sequence assumes a fall start. It may be modified for a summer or spring start and for part-time attendance. Selected BHC courses may be offered in summer or during minimester.

#### **NOTES**

- 1. The AA degree requires 7 semester hours of general education science by taking one IAI GECC Life Science courses and one IAI GECC Physical Science course, one of which must have a lab.
- 2. The listed U.S. History, Art/Music/Theater and Political Science courses are not specifically required for the WIU major; however, they are <u>strongly recommended</u> to prepare for content testing leading to teacher licensure.

Also note that the Humanities/Fine Arts requirement must include courses from two different disciplines. The Social Behavioral Science requirement must include courses from two different disciplines.

- 3. Black Hawk awards articulated credit to students who completed EDUC 103, EDUC 104 and/or EDUC 105 while in high school offered through participating "Grow Your Own" teacher preparation programs. Students should make their official high school transcript available to BHC for review. Students who did not take these courses in high school may complete WIU's equivalent C & I courses in the first semester after transfer.
- 4. The Early Childhood Education option has a very prescribed curriculum so students should not take random electives. If additional courses are needed to complete the AA degree, see a BHC advisor for recommendations. ENG 100 and/or REA 103 (taken only if required by assessment) will count as electives in the AA and transfer to WIU as electives.
- 5. Students transferring before completing the AA degree or the Illinois Articulation Initiative General Education Core may need additional hours to meet WIU's 43-credit University General Education Curriculum.
- 6. Students are encouraged to view the <u>WIU Transfer Pointers</u> and visit the <u>WIU program website</u> for details about admission, assessment, student teaching and licensure.
